# SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

## Corporate Academy South

Corporate Academy South Senior High School is an alternative school of choice for students who, for various reasons, have been unsuccessful in the traditional high school setting. Our students represent every major ethnic group and every economic level. Our school utilized the Continuous Improvement Model to help guide instruction.

Given reading instruction in the Sunshine State Standards and Competency Based Curriculum, 51 percent of ninth grade and tenth grade students at Corporate Academy South will meet or exceed state proficiency standards in reading (Level 3 or higher) as evidenced by student performance on the 2007 FCAT Reading administration.

Given mathematics instruction in the Sunshine State Standards and the Competency Based Curriculum, 56 percent of ninth and tenth grade students at Corporate Academy South will meet or exceed state proficiency standards in mathematics (level 3 or higher) as evidenced by student performance on the 2007 FCAT Mathematics administration.

Given instruction in the Sunshine State Standards and the Competency Based Curriculum 64 percent of tenth grade students at Corporate Academy South Senior High school will score 3.5 or higher on the 2007 FCAT writing administration.

Given instruction in the Sunshine State Standards and the Competency Based Curriculum, 31 percent of eleventh grade students at Corporate Academy South Senior High School will Score a level 3 or higher on the 2007 FCAT Science administration.

Thirty percent or more of the parents or guardians of Corporate Academy South Senior High School students will participate in school related activities in 2007 as evidenced by documentation logs.

Corporate Academy South Senior High School will exceed the parent, student, and staff 2006 School Climate Survey scores, 0, 43, and 77 percent, respectively, related to school safety as documented by the 2007 School Climate Survey.

Given encouragement to expand the use of instructional technology, training, and support, Corporate Academy South Senior High School will implement the use of computer labs throughout the curriculum.

Given instruction in physical fitness, students will improve their health and fitness as evidenced by the FITNESSGRAM program test results.

Corporate Academy South Senior High will provide new course opportunities to students by expanding its elective curriculum and offering a Graphics Arts and Design program.

Corporate Academy South Senior High School will maintain the average ranking on the State of Florida (ROI) Return on Investment index for alternative education programs.

Ninety-two percent of 12th grade students will graduate as documented by the Florida Department of Education's 2007 Adequate Yearly Progress Report.

The school's mission statement empahsizes its goal of educating at-risk students to improve their chances of graduating and becoming productive, responsible citizens. Students receive the advantage of positive reinforcement, social and emotional support, a comprehensive curriculum, tutorial services, a mentor program, academic recognition, involvement in extra curricular activities, and an incentive program.

# School Demographics

Corporate Academy South Senior High School accommodates up to ninety students who live south of Kendall Drive. We currentely have 72 students enrolled. Students come with poor self concepts driven by lack of academic achievement in school as well as overwhelming personal obstacles to overcome. Deficient organizational and study skills contribute to their feelings of inadequacy. Our students often feel singled out and ostracized. Our students suffer from depression as well as lack of motivation. The challenge is to keep them interested and engaged in school, assisting them in meeting their personal challenges as they face graduation. Although teachers have a smaller teacher to student ratio than in a traditional school, they are faced with seemingly overwhelming odds. Our student population is 7 percent white, 49 percent black, and 44 percent Hispanic. Seventy-one percent of our students are eligible for free or reduced lunch. Our staff demographics are as follows: twenty-one percent are white; thirty-seven percent black and forty-two percent are Hispanic. The School Advisory Council (SAC) and staff have developed the School Improvement Plan (SIP) objectives in order to address the most critical needs of the school.

## **School Foundation**

## Leadership:

The Organizational Performance Improvement assessment revealed a score of 4.6 in the area of Leadership. Our staff feels very strongly that administration is doing a great job sharing information about the work location.

#### District Strategic Planning Alignment:

The Organizational Performance Improvement assessment revealed a score of 4.0 in the area of Strategic Planning. Staff members feel administration asks for their ideas and input. They also feel they are making progress in the school.

### Stakeholder Engagement:

The Organizational Performance Improvement assessment revealed a score of 4.5 in the area of Customer and Market Focus. Staff members feel they know who their most important cutomers are and that they know if the customers are satisfied or not.

#### Faculty & Staff:

The Organizational Performance Improvement assessment revealed a score of 4.2 in the area of Human Resource Focus. Employees feel they have a safe workplace and that the administration cares about them. They also feel they are being recognized for their work.

#### Needs Assessment

District and state statistical data confirm that 77 percent of ninth graders and 97 percent of tenth grade students at Corporate Academy South scored below Level 3 on the 2006 FCAT administration. An examination of district data indicates that Developmental Scale Scores increased for ninth grade students and increased for tenth grade students on the 2006 FCAT when compared to similar scores on the 2005 FCAT Administration. The lowest 25 percent are below mastery on content clusters. Benchmark assessments are focused on all content clusters because students scores indicate that all content cluster are below 70 percent.

#### Needs Assessment

District and state statistical data confirm that 68 percent of ninth graders and 61 percent of tenth grade students at Corporate Academy South scored at or below level 3 on the 2006 FCAT Mathematics administration. In addition, the number of tenth grade students scoring at or above level 3 on the 2006 FCAT administration declined by 27 percent when compared to similiar data on the 2005 FCAT administration. By providing FCAT enhancement instruction in targeted mathmatics skill areas, Developmental Scale Scores will increase, impacting the number of students scoring at or above level 3 on the 2007 FCAT administration. A progressive increase of 5 percent or higher in the number of students scoring at or above Achievement Level 3 on subsequent FCAT administrations will be attained at Corporate Academy South as evidenced by student achievement scores on FCAT examinations administered from March 2007 to March 2010. By 2010, 80 percent or more of the students will be proficient in mathematics as defined by state standards. The lowest 25 percent are below mastery level on all content clusters with an emphasis on measurements.
